Bolton Hall Museum Home of Little Landers Historical Society

1913 Little Lands Colony is established and Bolton Hall is built as the town meeting hall or "Clubhouse" After the Little Lands colony is disbanded, the American Legion purchases Bolton Hall 1922 1925 Tujunga is incorporated as a city, purchases Bolton Hall from the American Legion and Bolton Hall becomes Tujunga City Hall 1932 Tujunga is annexed by Los Angeles, Bolton Hall becomes an L.A. City Hall outpost 1959 Los Angeles plans to demolish Bolton Hall. Two preservation-minded ladies, Starr von Fluss and Roberta Stewart, establish Little Landers Historical Society (LLHS) to save Bolton Hall from destruction. 1962 Bolton Hall is designated Los Angeles City Historic Cultural Monument #2 1959 to 1978 The fight to save and restore Bolton Hall continues for 19 years 1979 Funding is received and Bolton Hall is restored Bolton Hall becomes a museum and opens to the public 1980 1980 to Little Landers Historical Society operates Bolton Hall Museum. Present Day Little Landers Historical Society is an all-volunteer organization. We have been (45 years) dedicated to preserving our local history for 66 years The museum is the repository for the history of Rancho Tujunga which encompasses Tujunga, Sunland, Shadow Hills and parts of Lake View Terrace and Sun Valley We are open to the public on Saturday and Sunday from 1 to 4 PM, free of charge We are available to offer private presentations and tours to schools, church and • community groups, and other organizations by appointment, free of charge Our 2nd Saturday programs feature presentations by guest speakers on topics of • historical and cultural interest nine months out of the year, free of charge Our Holiday Party in December is a community favorite • Our archives and photo collection are extensive and available for researchers by appointment, free of charge We rely on donations, membership dues and fundraisers to accomplish our mission: To preserve Bolton Hall Museum and the historical record of Rancho Tujunga
